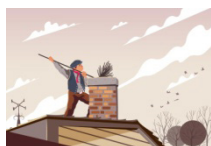

It was Lucinda and Jane's house. In fact, it was Lucinda's, but she never ordered meals.

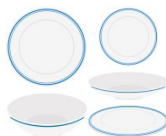
Jane was the cook, but she never cooked, because the dinner was ready-made, in a box.

Tom Thumb was a mouse.

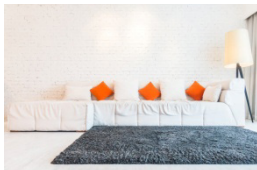
A minute after, Hunca Munca, his wife, put her head, too.
